Official Rules of the Guilford Lakes Improvement Association

These regulations were voted on and approved June 11, 2007, by the GLIA Board of Governors in accordance with Section 12 of The Act Incorporating the Guilford Lakes Improvement Association (the Association), which further empowers the Board of Governors to enforce, and to hire constables to help enforce, these regulations. Violators are subject to fines and may be denied use of the beaches for a period not to exceed 30 days.

- 1. The Beaches are private. Members must check their guests in at the beach.
- 2. Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult while on the beaches.
- 3. Fires and glass containers are prohibited from the beaches.
- 4. Littering of beaches and all Association property is prohibited.
- 5. Horseplay or roughhousing on beaches is prohibited.
- 6. Dogs and other pets are prohibited from the beaches.
- 7. The beaches are closed at 9:00 PM. Use of the beaches after that hour requires prior approval from the Board of Governors.
- 8. Trespassing upon, or diving from the dams of the Association is prohibited.
- 9. Diving from the North Madison Road Bridge is prohibited.
- 10. Outboard motors are not permitted on the lakes except for official lake maintenance. All boats must stay out of the swimming areas.
- 11. Overnight parking of any vehicle on the Association property is prohibited.
- 12. No dumping of leaves, grass or any waste into the lakes or on other Association Property.
- 13. Lakefront property owners have the additional responsibility to remove any branches, trees or shrubbery that fall from their property into the lake.
- 14. Parties at the beaches with 10 or more guests require prior approval of the Board of Governors.

The Association beaches are privately owned and maintained for the exclusive use of Association members. Membership is limited to owners of property, or renters, within strict geographic boundaries; members pay an annual tax to the Association. Use of Association beaches is restricted to Association members who are current with tax payments. A failure to enforce any of these regulations will not be deemed a waiver of the right to enforce them in the future.

Violations of Town Ordinances, such as roaming dogs, late night disturbances, unregistered motor vehicles, mailbox vandalism and violation of inland wetlands regulations should be reported to the Guilford Police Department. Association members have a right and responsibility to remind violators of these regulations and report abusers to the Board. PARENTS, please make sure your children are fully aware of these regulations.
